



# A-G table for UC & CSU / Community College requirements

**University Admission Requirements:** To qualify for admission you must meet the subject, GPA & exam requirements. A student must receive *no lower than a C grade in college prep and AP/IB/Honors courses* to be eligible for a four-year university. To meet the university admission requirements, students need to get *mostly A & B grades*. Students need *close to a 3.0 academic grade point average (GPA)* or better.
